World Wide Cinema

A Call Girl is the feature film that will be showing at World-Wide Cinema on Friday, July 9, 7 pm, in the large meeting room at the Missoula Public Library.

Alexandra, having grown up in a small town in Slovenia, embraces the excitement and anonymity of big city life when she moves to the capital city. She styles herself as a call girl, planning to take advantage of everything the city has to offer—working by day, call girl by night. But one of her clients, a visiting politician, dies of a heart attack on her watch. Alexandra must suddenly confront fear, guilt, and desperation as she finds herself pursued by a band of local pimps, as well as the cops. The old village life she had escaped from might now become her only refuge.

A Call Girl is directed by Damjan Kozole, and stars Nina Ivanisin in her first professional film role as Alexandra. The film is 91 minutes long, in Slovenian with English subtitles, and is not rated. Doors at the lower level open at 6:45 pm.

He rejects revenge, forgives his oppressors and finds hope of national unity in an unlikely place: the rugby field. Clint Eastwood powerfully directs an uplifting movie about a team and a people inspired to greatness. Morgan Freeman portrays Mandela, who asks the national rugby team captain (Matt Damon) and his underdog squad to do the impossible and win the World Cup. One team, one country. The universal language of sports has never spoken so thrillingly as in Eastwood's ***Invictus***.

Cheap Date Night is July 16 at 7 pm. The movie is 134 minutes long and is rated PG-13. Parking lot doors will open at 6:45 pm. The popcorn is free.
