"Roads to Koktebel" tells the story of a father and son's journey from Moscow to Koktebel. For the father the journey is an attempt to restore his self-respect and win back the trust of his son; for the boy, Koktebel holds the key to a new life.

The film is in Russian with English subtitles.

Also being shown is a short film, "The Box Man." This film uses a cardboard box to tell a tale of urban paranoia and the desire to remain hidden.

Showtime is 7 p.m. in the Large Meeting Room. The doors open at 6:45 p.m. on the lower level by the parking lot.

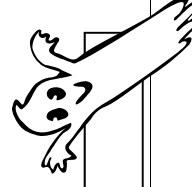
