RE-IMAGINING DEATH: CONVERSATIONS ABOUT DYING, LOSS, AND GRIEF

Missoula Public Library partners with the University of Montana Humanities Institute on this series of informal talks, lectures, and book club events designed to engage our community in discussion about death, dying, and loss. In the wake of a devastating epidemic, issues around the concept of death are as timely as ever. Throughout 2022, MPL hosts two events each month (one event in January). UM professors from a range of disciplines will present short lectures and generate discussions on: death rituals and beliefs around the world (African, Hindu, Irish, Middle Eastern); death experiences from the past; shifting attitudes in cultural practices like funerals, cremation, and end-of-life experiences; new movements to de-stigmatize discussions of death; and other related topics. The aim is to build community through public engagement with a challenging topic during challenging times.
