ARCHIVES OPENS CENSUS FILE

The National Archives has opened files of the 1910 census, providing an anticipated treasure of information for genealogists, historians and other researchers.

The law requires census information on individuals to be kept confidential for 72 years.

Researchers will be able to study the material on microfilm at the archives, and copies are expected to be made available at archives branch offices across the country by fall. Copies of the microfilm will also be available for sale by the archives.

The information on individuals is organized by state and county and the larger counties are also subdivided into cities. There are 1,784 rolls of microfilm census records and 4,642 rolls of indexes.

For each person listed in the 1910 census, the newly released files include full name, race, age at last birthday, sex, marital status, length of present marriage, place of birth, parents' place of birth, citizenship, occupation, number of weeks employed in 1909, ability to read and write, language spoken and whether or not a veteran of the Civil War.

Since the Federal Census microfilms are no longer available on inter-library loan, a letter to your congressman may help to re-instate this much needed research "tool".
