THE FAMILY REGISTRY

This new service is being offered free of charge by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

Individual researchers and Family Organizations may register the names of deceased persons that they are currently researching or have researched in the past.

Microfiche copies of these registration forms and a surname index of the registry will then be available for searching at the Genealogical Library in Salt Lake City and at the branch libraries.

This new registry will allow you to easily find persons and family groups that are working on the same lines as you are and to establish contact with them. Persons interested in forming family groups are also invited to register.

Two types of registration forms will be available. The Research Coordination Registration Form (PFGS2501), for active researchers, and the Family Organization Registration Form(PFGS2512) will be available at the Genealogical Library and its branches or you can write for forms to:

COMPUTERS AND GENEALOGY:

While browsing through the genealogy collection (which now is close to filling our shelves) at the Missoula County Library, I came across an edition of the Association of Professional Genealogists Newsletter (Jan '82) devoted entirely to computers in genealogy.

While many computer databases are being created with genealogi-cal applications for us to use on our home computers, there are few direct, online computer searches available. It was mentioned that the Genealogical Society hopes eventually to have computer terminals in the branch libraries around the world to make a computerized search of their Title Catalogue possible.

The library of Congress is also converting to a computerized, online catalogue.

For those who have home computers and files of names to search, there was a "Soundex" program written in Basic in the above mentioned issue of APG Newsletter. This program will allow your computer to convert your list of surnames to their soundex codes to permit searching for variations of spelling of surnames.
