At our last meeting in January, ir hayes Otoupalik gave a lively and interesting talk on his collect Library. ing of military memorabilia. Ir. Otoupalik's perseverance, often over a period of several years, in his quest for a particular item

was not unlike many a genealogists quest. One story stressed the importance of talking to people of the age group of the person he was interested in in trying to revive old memories and rekindle associations. He talked of the help, which might also be useful to genealogists, which he had received from veterans groups. He also noted that there is an Index OF Medal Of Monor Winners in the government documents publications (available at the University of Hontana Library, Documents Division) which could be checked by anyone who thinks an ancestor may have won a medal of honor in one of America's wars. An interesting note on montana history presented by Mr. Otoupalik was that the Calvary Unit of the Spanish-Federal Savings and Loan, Southgate American War Squadron from Hontana never left the United States, while a medal they had struck may imply otherwise.
