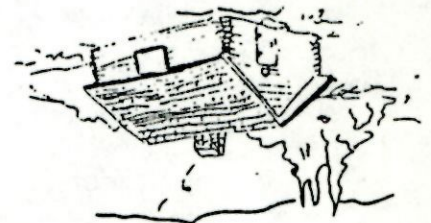

ague	used to describe the recurring fever and chills of malarial infection
aphonia	laryngitis
biliousness	jaundice or other symptoms associated with liver disease
camp fever	typhus
canine madness	hydrophobia
chlorosis	iron deficiency anemia
corruption	infection
coryza	a cold
costiveness	constipation
cramp colic	appendicitis
dropsy	edema (swelling), sometimes caused by kidney or heart disease
dyspepsia	acid indigestion
extravasted blood	rupture of blood vessel
falling sickness	epilepsy
flus of humour	circulation
French pox	venereal disease
green sickness	anemia
hip gout	osteomyelitis
