She has some interesting material on using the Personal Ancestral File genealogy program including some shareware updates and information on setting up a PAF users group. She also has obtained some forms that allow you to catalogue family possessions and keep track of where family heirlooms are. If anyone has come across anything new which could help ,in the genealogical research process or in the preserving of family records please bring the information to the meeting to share and swap.

Newly arrived at the FHC are the Scottish Parish Register Indexes. These are on microfiche in the most used books on microfiche cabinet. There are four indexes for each Scottish Parish - a surname and a given name index for both births and deaths. These are only from the registers of the official Scottish Presbyterian Church and users should first carefully read the instruction on the first fiche card.

IN THE MAIL

National Genealogical Society Quarterly, Vol.79,No.3, Sept. 1991. An article called "Numbering Your Genealogy: Sound and Simple Systems", by Joan Ferris Curran presents four numbering systems that can be used when writing your genealogy. There are two ascending and two descending systems presented.

NGS NEWSLETTER, Vol.17, No.5, sept.-Oct. 1991. Here you will find a five page article that anyone who has done genealogical research should read. It is "What Happens To My Research When I'm Gone?", by Jo White Linn who makes the point that "a collection worth preserving is worth the time and effort to put it into correct form by the person who knows it best" - you!

The NGS Newsletter also mentioned that the NGS/CIG Digest, published by the NGS Computer Interest Group is again being mailed quarterly to NGS members. The most recent issue (July, Aug., Sept. 1991) had two articles on using the PAFprograms - one on using the notes feature, and another that showed how to use the Family Records program instead of the Research Data Filer to keep track of your research notes, as well as a good tip about how to use the GEDCOM program to repack your data files after deleting records (which apparently leaves gaps of unused bytes on your disks which wastes disk space).

You're Invited to Participate in The Ancestral File

A Genealogy Database Created For The People, By the People

Genealogical bulletin boards across the United States, and some parts of Canada, have joined in a cooperative effort to aid in the expansion of the ANCESTRAL FILE submission program. This project, conceived and organized by John Grove, SysOp of Ancestry TBBS, and Lance Jacob of the Ancestral File Operations Unit in Salt Lake City, is receiving remarkable support from the Genealogical community. As of 25 June 1991, the SysOps of fourteen bulletin boards have agreed to participate by serving as collection points where callers can "upload" their GEDCOM files. These files will then be forwarded to the LDS Family History Center in Salt Lake City for inclusion in future updates of the ANCESTRAL FILE portion of the FamilySearch™ program.

Submitting disks to the Family History Center containing multiple GEDCOM files will help automate the process of updating this important database and enable it to be as current as technically possible. The project will also encourage procrastinating genealogists to contribute their files by allowing them to simply "upload" a GEDCOM file to their nearest BBS without the hassle of finding a suitable disk mailer and determining the proper amount of postage. Please note that there is NO cost to the genealogist for this service.

Contributions are accepted in GEDCOM format ONLY and must be created using a genealogy program registered with the Ancestral File Operations Unit.

MANSFIELD LIBRARY - University of Montana

If your Montana ancestor was a Freemason you may want to look at the Freemasons Montana Grand Lodge Proceedings. M366.109786 F8555, which are located in the Montana Collection of the Archives and Special Collections Division of the Mansfield Library (U of M). These contain lists of Lodge Members from all of the Montana lodges and the library has volumes from 1889-1955 with only a few scattered years missing.

The Archives has the Missoula, Montana - School District #1 Papers, 1913-1970. These contain Teachers payroll 1913-1925, and selected class registers from 1907-1918, 1931-1944, 1955-1956, 1960-1961, 1965-1966, 1969-1970. These registers contain only the class grade and student names. Parents names are not listed.

The Archives contain the old records of many of the older Missoula businesses, described in the pamphlet "Missoula Area Business Collections", Archives Guide No. 3, as well as records of the older lumbr companies described in Archives Guide No. 7, "Timber and Forest Industry Collections".

The Microfile Clipping File "contains microfilm copies of newspaper articles and other materials relative to towns, peopla mad activities important to Montana's past. The entries are arranged alphabetically by subject. These films do not circulate but may be copied." There is a micrifiche edition of this file which is available at the Family History Center in Missoula. This edition has two divisions - subject and surname - with both arranged alphabetically.

An interesting ad in the Genealogical Helper, Sept.-Oct. 1991, p.119, listed a series of genealogy cassettes made for a cable TV series called "Family Historian", hosted and produced by Stephen Conte. The VHS videocassettes of the program are available for purchase for \$20.00 each including postage and shipping. Titles include Census Records, Military Records, Locating Immigrant Ancestors, Preserving Old Documents, Restoring Old Graveyards, Genetics and Genealogy, and a number of cassettes on researching the various nationality groups. A COMPUTER SPEEDS THINGS UP A BIT

A message on the National Genealogy Echo provides another good reason for using a computer. The message stated that genealogies contributed on disks submitted to Salt Lake before Oct. 1, 1991 will be at local LDS libraries on CD-ROM about March 1, 1992 while all hand-written submissions will take up to three years to post on the CD-ROM.
