MONTHLY MEETINGS are held on the second Thursday of the month (Sept.-May) at 7:00 pm in the small meeting room of the Missoula Public Library.

At the September meeting we had a presentation by Dave Roth of 1-Hour Pro Photo Labs. He talked about the new Fuji process that makes copies on photographic quality archival paper. These cost slightly more than laser copies, but are of better quality. Copies can be enlarged up to 200% or reduced to 50%. The process will copy pictures, slides, tin types, and even solid objects will copy with about a 3/8 in. depth of field. Color and density can be changed a little. Mr. Roth will give a 10% discount to members of the WMGS. (See flier).

Marsha Porter reported that the Genealogical Society of Utah has begun filming some Missoula County records including probate records from 1900 on. Statewide marriage records are also being filmed.

OCTOBER MEETING we will meet on Thursday, Oct. 14th. Pat Thompson from the Bitterroot Genealogical Society will talk on naturalization and immigration records.

NOVEMBER MEETING Due to the Veterans Day holiday the Missoula public library will be closed on the second Thursday of November. <u>We will meet on</u> the first Thursday, Nov. 4th.

MONTANA STATE GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY MEETING IN MISSOULA

The MSGS met in Missoula on Saturday, Sept. 12th. An interesting note was that there was a bill being proposed that "all" would require genealogists be licensed before they are allowed access to public records in county courthouses and state agencies. This bill, if passed, would effectively bar lay researchers from access to tax funded public records. The legality of the bill was discussed, and the



matter was referred to members in Helena for investigation and motivation behind the proposal. All genealogists should contact local politicians and express their opinion of this bill!

As a fund raiser, the MSGS is selling small pins with their logo on them. These are available with or without loops to attach yearly pins from the annual state seminars. I have several of each type for sale at \$3.50 each. They will be available at our monthly meetings.

The ideas for the state seminar to be jointly hosted in Missoula next Apr. 8-10th by the WMGS/Bitterroot Gen. Soc. were presented. The theme will be "Bits, Bytes, and Bull", and the pre-registration fee will remain \$35.00.

The statewide birth and death record indexing project is now underway. Sam Sperry, of the Bureau of Vital Records. has agreed to provide a room and 2 computers which will be available from 8am - 5pm, Mon.-Fri. for inputting from the state records. We will start with the deaths. The indexes will give date, place, county, name, and a code number corresponding to the actual record in the files. There will be two orientation sessions in Helena, one on Friday, Oct. 15th at 1:00pm, and another on Friday, Nov. 5th at 10am to show volunteers what they will need to know to help with this project. We need to know by the Wednesday before how many people will be goint to Helena. A schedule will be set up so that volunteers can call ahead to set up work times. The Nov. 5th orientation session will be followed by lunch and a MSGS board meeting. We have a group planning to go to Helena for this. Anyone who wants to go is welcome.


