NEW TROJAN HORSE VIRUS MASQUERAÐING AS UNZIP PROGRAM

"A new Trojan horse virus has emerged on the Internet with the name **PKZIP300.ZIP**, so named as to give the impression that this file is a new version of the PKZIP software used to ZIP (compress) files. **Do not download this file under any circumstances!** If you install or expand this file, the virus will wipe your hard disk and affect modems at 14.4 and higher. This is an extremely destructive virus and there is not yet a way of cleaning up this one." Both Microsoft and Pkware (author of pkunzip) have confirmed the existence of this bogus program.

MSWORD MACRO VIRUS

BITS AND BYTES

Another cleverly disguised 'virus' may be hiding in a downloaded word.doc word processing file. These viruses are actually macros which are embedded in the document. Opening the document starts the macro. Microsoft has released a program called MVTOOL10.EXE which comes with some anti-virus programs or can be downloaded free from Microsoft in the MSOFFICE area, or I will make a copy of it.

NOTE ON NEW YORK IMMIGRATION RECORDS BEING INDEXED BY THE BALCH INSTITUTE

The following message recently appeared on the Internet concerning New York immigration records for the unindexed period from 1848-1903:

"The Balch Institute has been indexing the New York immigration records using student labor. The first product of this work was the four volume set of "The Famine Immigrants, Lists of Irish Immigrants Arriving at the Port of New York, 1846-1851" Vols 1-4, Baltimore, Genealogical Publ Co, 1983-1984, edited by Ira A. Glazier

The remaining records are being published under ethnic titles in chronological order of the date of the immigrants' arrival. Each volume is arranged chronological by ships arrival with a complete name index. The series continues down to the present with the series title: "Germans to America: Lists of Passengers Arriving at U.S. Ports, published by the Gale Research and "Italians to America: Lists of Passengers Arriving at U.S. Ports". The entire series' project is edited by Drs. Ira A. Glazier and Michael Tepper."

Richard_Pence@p3565.f356.n109.z1.fidonet.org (Richard Pence) added the following qualification to the content of these records:

"Genealogists using these sources should be aware of their shortcomings as genealogical references. These are delineated in detail by Gordon L. Remington, "Feast or Famine: Problems in the Genealogical Use of The Famine Immigrants and Germans to America," _The National Genealogical Society Quarterly_, Vol. 78, No. 2, June 1990, pages 135-146.

Without going into great detail about the specific problems, it should be noted that both of these series are statistical/sociological studies and do not purport to be a complete listing of the ships which arrived nor do they include all of the passengers on those ships for which lists are given."

ACCESS TO RECORDS REPORT

From BIG SKY ROUNDUP, March 1996

Vital records director Sam Sperry and staff member Bev Roberts met with representatives from LCCGS and MSGS on Thursday< January 25, 1996. The meeting accomplished the presentation of numerous questions and proposals related to the access of the records in the Department and in the county offices. The Director responded openly and with willingness to include our input to the rules accompanying the new statutes.

Some of the problems that the Department is facing include a move to a different building in April. The vault will remain in the Cogswell Building so to look for records Sperry will have to station personnel there and run the records across the street. A second problem is that Sperry has a new legal staff to deal with and he has to educate them to the understanding of Vital Records.

The rule-making process will be that he will take our suggestion, gather comments from the Clerk & Recorders and any other interested people and put together a

proposal and then it will go to the legal staff for formal drafting. At that point it will be tough to get any changes. The next step is to the Administrative Code Committee for public hearings (about a 90 day process.) At this time we are awaiting the initial draft from the Department.

Two major concerns of the Department are the release of birth records and the inclusion of "cause of death" on death records.

Director Sperry stated that he will make appropriate contacts with the LDS Church to determine their interest in microfilming state records within the confines of the new statutes.
