CD Updates: Social Security Death Index - now list deaths to Dec. 1995; the **Library Card Catalogue** has been updated to show entries as of Feb. 1996; the **Main IGI** has new CD's for Germany, Continental Europe and Southwest Europe; the **IGI Addendum** has received updated disks #2 and #4 which contain entries as of 5/96.

POSSIBLE ALTERATION OF RECORDS COPIED FROM ANCESTRAL FILE

Problem. If you used *Family Search* and copied recordsfrom *Ancestral File Version 4.16* (the one we had), some of the records you copied may have been altered. The version was in use between January and July 1996.

A software problem may have changed marriage information on records copied from *ancestral File's* Pedigree Chart Screen (but not the Family Records screen). If you copied a record that contained a divorce,

(**Div**) will be inserted into the records of all direct-line ancestors of that couple. This will happen even when the ancestors were not divorced.

The problem will not spread to other records. Only the records copied from the *Ancestral File 4.16* will be affected.

Identifying the problem. First, go to the computer where you copied the records. Check whyther or not you used Version 4.16 (the version number is found on the top line of the *Ancestral File* screen). If necessary, ask when Version 4.16 was used on the computer.

Next, use *Personal Ancestral File* on your computer and go to the Large Pedigree Chart screen. Look at the records you copied. (**Div**) will appear in the marriage information (upper-left corner of screen) of any records that were changed.

Also check records that were merged with records you copied.

Correcting the problem. There are three ways you can use *Personal Ancestral File* to correct the problem:

- Choose the Modify Records option. Edit the marriage records in the direct ancestral line where the problem occurred. Type "N" in the "Divorced?" field.Go to the Pedigree Search Screen. Use the MRIN Browse feature and edit the marriage record. Type "N" in the "Divorced?" field.
- Use backup copies you made before you copied the records from *Ancestral File*.

Corrected version. You can safely recopy records from *Ancestral File Version 416F.*

BITS AND BYTES

IGIREAD - This is a freeware program made available by the LDS. Amongst other things, it output GEDCOM info in the style you want. The program is available on the web at the following ftp site (or contact Judith Field for a copy):

I have found this program very useful when I wanted to collect all of the data on a particular surname from the IGI. You download the info from the IGI onto a disk in GEDCOM format then use this program to output the info in formatted ASCII, comma delimited format, or d-Base III/IV. You can then read the output file into most any spread sheet program. This is a good way of saving info on a lot of people that you do not necessarily want to add to your PAF data files. In the spreadsheet program you can search and sort your data any way you want to. You can also add more than one GEDCOM file to the output file that will be read by your spreadsheet program. I have combined all the data I found on one surname from both the Individual and Marriage searches in both the Main IGI and the IGI Addendum (4 searches on the IGI) into one spreadsheet file.

NEAT ICON FOR YOUR GENEALOGY
