Consequently, all of the CD's have been removed from their former cases and are "live". They need to be handled with more care but don't be intimidated by them. It takes a while to get comfortable with the new system but the librarians will stay with you until you get the hang of it.

New Library Card Catalogue: The FHL has received a new microfiche edition of the catalogue dated February 1996. This is now the latest version.

Ancestral File Update: The rumor is that the update to Ancestral File through February 1996 is "in the mail". It may take some time before a copy reaches Missoula., but be sure to call ahead for computer time because once this arrives the computer will in all likelihood be "booked solid" for weeks.

New Family History Libraries: Both Drummond and St. Ignatius have received approval to have a Family History Library. The one in Drummond will probably operate on Wednesdays from 1:00-9:00 PM. Due to its location the library in St. Ignatius will only be open to LDS members.

Microfilm Renewal Policy: The policy is that films can only be kept in the Missoula FHL for 2 years. Films that are originally ordered for 3 weeks may have 4 6-month renewals, and films originally ordered for 6-months may have up to 3 6-month renewals. Films that have already been in the library for 2 years (before this policy came into effect) may be renewed only one more time. Any exceptions to the policy must be made by the library director, Ladene Hughes. Census films may still be ordered on indefinite loan if the patron pays the full \$6.00 charge.

The Source: The FHL will be ordering the new edition of "The Source" which has just been released.

INDEXING

The group indexing of the MISSOULIAN is continuing on Tuesdays at 1:00 PM in the Montana Room of the Missoula Public Library. Once you've been trained on what to do, any time that the library is open, it's OK to come on in and index! We're in 1927 at the present.

SANDERS COUNTY BURIALS

MAURICE HELTERLINE writes that he is continuing to index the Sanders County Burials and has sent a new printout of his index that is part way through 1996. This current volume will continue through 31 December 1999. He continues to index the Plainsman for obituaries and says that other newspapers that still need to be done when he gets the time are: the Sanders County Ledger (Thompson Falls), the Sanders County Signal, the Hot Springs Sentinel, and the Ronan Pioneer which he believes began publication in 1910. Paulette has a printout of the materials that Maurice sent at the Public Library if anyone needs to check this information on Sanders County.
