FINDING MONTANA RESOURCES ON ANCESTRY.COM

If you select the SEARCH tab from the Ancestry.com home page you will find the SEARCH RESOURCES box towards the top right hand corner of the page. Here you will find links to the CARD CATALOG and the new ADVANCED SEARCH (See Ancestry.com Update for more on this.)

CARD CATALOG. This option will allow you to search for a database by title or keyword, or browse an alphabetical list of databases. Just entering "Montana" as a keyword will bring up 198 sources including census, military, newspapers, etc...At the bottom of the card catalog page is another box

with FEATURED SITES. Here you can follow the FAMILY **HISTORY** link to Family History databases listed by state, or the FAMILY BIRTH RECORDS link to birth records listed by state. Choosing Montana after following either link will bring up a hyperlinked list containing possible sources of Family History or Birth records for Montana. You can follow each link to find out more information on that source, like years covered for the newspapers, and then do a search of that source. There are "helpful hints" for searching and other helpful links on both of these featured sites.

The September meeting of the Western Montana Genealogical Society will be held on Tuesday, September 12th, 7-9 p.m. at the Missoula City/County Library large meeting room. The program will be "Native American Genealogical Research" presented by George Price. The majority of his personal genealogical research has been done in the eastern US. George Price, an Adjunct Professor at UM, is a historian who focuses on African Americans and Native Americans in the colonial and pre-Civil War periods. He is the co-author with James Brewer Stewart of "To Heal the Scourge of Prejudice: The Life and Writings of Hosea Easton," and is currently within about a year of completion of a book on five generations of human rights activists in the Easton family. New Advanced Search Beta Test

This new Advanced Search is still being tested. It allows you to search all records on the site and allow selected fields to match your search criteria exactly by checking or un-checking the *exact matches* checkbox and using SOUNDEX to search for surnames.

US Census Collection Complete

With the launch of the fully indexed 1910 U.S. Census, Ancestry.com becomes the only online resource providing access to all U.S. Census records from 1790 to 1930.

WWII Draft Registration Cards

These are from the 4th registration or "Old Man's Registration" dated 27 April 1942. It Include men born on or between 25 April 1877—16 February 1897 or who were 45-64 years old. The information includes name, age, birth date, birth place, residence, employer, contact, and physical description.

1901 & 1906 Canada Census

Ancestry.com is already home to the first and only fully indexed 1911 Census of Canada. These recent additions add 6 million new names in the 1901 Census of Canada and the 1906 Census of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta.

300 Titles to Online Database Collection

The scanned books cover the topics of vital records, immigration, military, histories, biographies, and more from the early 1600s to the 1900s.
