The FamilySearch.org home page has a fresh new look with several new tabs. Across the top of the page you will find the following tabs: Home, Search Records, Index Records (allows you to become a volunteer indexer), Share (you records), Research Helps, Library (link to the FHL card catalog), and Help.

Home Page— check out the "Start Your Family History" box for help with *Getting Started, Research Guides, Forms,*Maps, and other resources.

Search Records Tab has some old & new features:

- Advanced Search—takes you to the familiar search page of the old FamilySearch page.
- Record Search Pilot –

with FindMyPast.com and the actual images are available at FindMyPast for a fee if you use FamilySearch from your home, but are free if you come into the Family History Library and use FamilySearch there. All of the England & Wales Census from 1841-1901 will eventually be available.

- Library Catalog –FHL card catalog
- Family History Archives—takes you to a search page for the digital Family History Collection of the Harold B. Lee Library of BYU. This is a huge collection of fully indexed, downloadable Family Histories.
- Web Sites—has links to pages with information on various types of records.

Records Added to Pedigree Resource File
While checking out the new FamilySearch page
I also discovered that a gedcom file of my ancestors that I had submitted back in October of
2007 had been added to the Pedigree Resource
File. It's possible that many new gedcom files
have now been added to the Pedigree Resource File which is searchable via the Search
Records, Advanced Search Tab on
FamilySearch.org. NOTE: The information from
my gedcom file that was found on FamilySearch
was not found in a search on NewFamilySearch
so it looks like information is not being added to
both sites at the same time. If you have access
to both sites, you need to search both of them.

On July 21, 2008, Ancestry.com and FamilySearch announced that they will exchange records and resources. The first project will enhance the US Federal Census Collection (1790-1930) as Family Search is digitally converting master microfilm copies of the original censuses and will give these images to Ancestry.com. Western States Marriage Record Index

Most of the pre-1900 marriages are included in the index for Arizona, Idaho and Nevada. Many counties for those same states have been extracted into the 1930's and some, much later. A significant number of marriages from selected counties in California, western Colorado, Montana, Oregon, Utah, eastern Washington, and Wyoming are also included. Very early marriages (1700's) in New Mexico are currently being added...At this time, the index is not comprehensive for the time period and/or localities described.
