 The Missoula City Cemetery was established in 1884 by the Missoula Valley Improvement Company, an incorporation owned by Dr Isadore Cohn. William H H Dickinson, Frank Woody, and Thomas C Marshall. The original land consisted of 16 acres. located three miles northwest of the city's center, and was a triangular section purchased from the Northern Pacific Railroad for \$168. The Missoula Valley Improvement Company commissioned H V Wheeler to survey

grave sites. These graves were used to inter 100 bodies of Japanese laborers moved from Plains MT to make room for the new rail line. Most of these sites remain unmarked to this day. A small few monuments written in Japanese have been placed.

19th Century British Library Newspaper Digital Archive— 19th Century British Library Newspapers website, managed by Gale Cengage, was launched on 22 October 2007, with 1 million pages of content. It provides researchers with the most comprehensive collection of national and regional newspapers of Victorian Britain available. This full-text, fully searchable digital archive currently includes 48 papers originating in England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland, carefully selected by an editorial board from the British Library and providing a broad yet detailed view of British life in the 19th century.
