1910 CENSUS

GOOD NEWS: The 1910 Census is now available to the public and is being sold by the National Archives. The University of Montana Library is purchasing the Montana reels of which there are 9. We are also ordering the 1910 Census Enumeration District Descriptions, Roll No. 33 which includes the states of Minnesota through New Mexico.

Indexes to the 1910 Census were created for only the following 21 states: Alabama, Arkansas, California, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and West Virginia. Too bad Montana wasn't included. Will let you know later on when the Montana reels are available for use in the Mansfield Library.

BIBLIOGRAPHY ON MILITARY AND PENSION RECORDS

During the past year I have been teaching various topics at our monthly Society meetings and I have discussed numerous titles of books pertaining to the topic. I also promised to give the membership a bibliography of the books which I have discussed. I am now beginning to do this and the first subject I have chosen is that of military records.

Along with the author, title, place of publication, publisher and date of publication, I have included the following: Library which has that publication and for those in Missoula, the call number under which the book can be found. I have included books found in the Mansfield Library (UM), the Missoula Branch Genealogical Library (MBGL), the Montana Historical Society Library (MHS), the Great Falls Public Library (GFP), and the Great Falls Genealogical Society (GFGS).

Not all the publications available on U.S. military history are listed. There are simply too many of them. I have only listed those which I have found listed in other bibliographies on the subject. Additional books can be found at the Mansfield Library by checking the "Card Catalog" under the following headings:

The best annotated bibliography of genealogical publications is AMERICAN & BRITISH GENEALOGY & HERALDRY: A SELECTED LIST OF BOOKS compiled by P. William Filby. 2nd ed. Chicago: American Library Association, 1975. This book is available at both the Mansfield Library and the Missoula Branch Genealogical Library. The annotations tell what the book does and often how reliable the information is and for this reason I have listed the number of the book when it appears in the Filby bibliography as (Filby 476). For additional information about the book, you would look up the entry 476 in Filby.

Campaign Against Swift Auto Driving

Chief of Police Gove is still prosecuting his campaign against the automobile drivers whom he thinks are running their machines too fast on the main thoroughfares of the city. Yesterday afternoon the chief signed a complaint in Justice Phillips' court charging Dr. Joseph Oettinger with exceeding the speed limit of eight miles an hour within the city limits. The chief claims that he made the complaint because the doctor tore across the bridge with his machine at a rate of about 20 miles an hour. The doctor has not been cited to appear to answer to the charge, but will probably be given notice of the complaint today. It is stated that other complaints of the same nature will be filed as soon as some of the necessary data can be secured.
