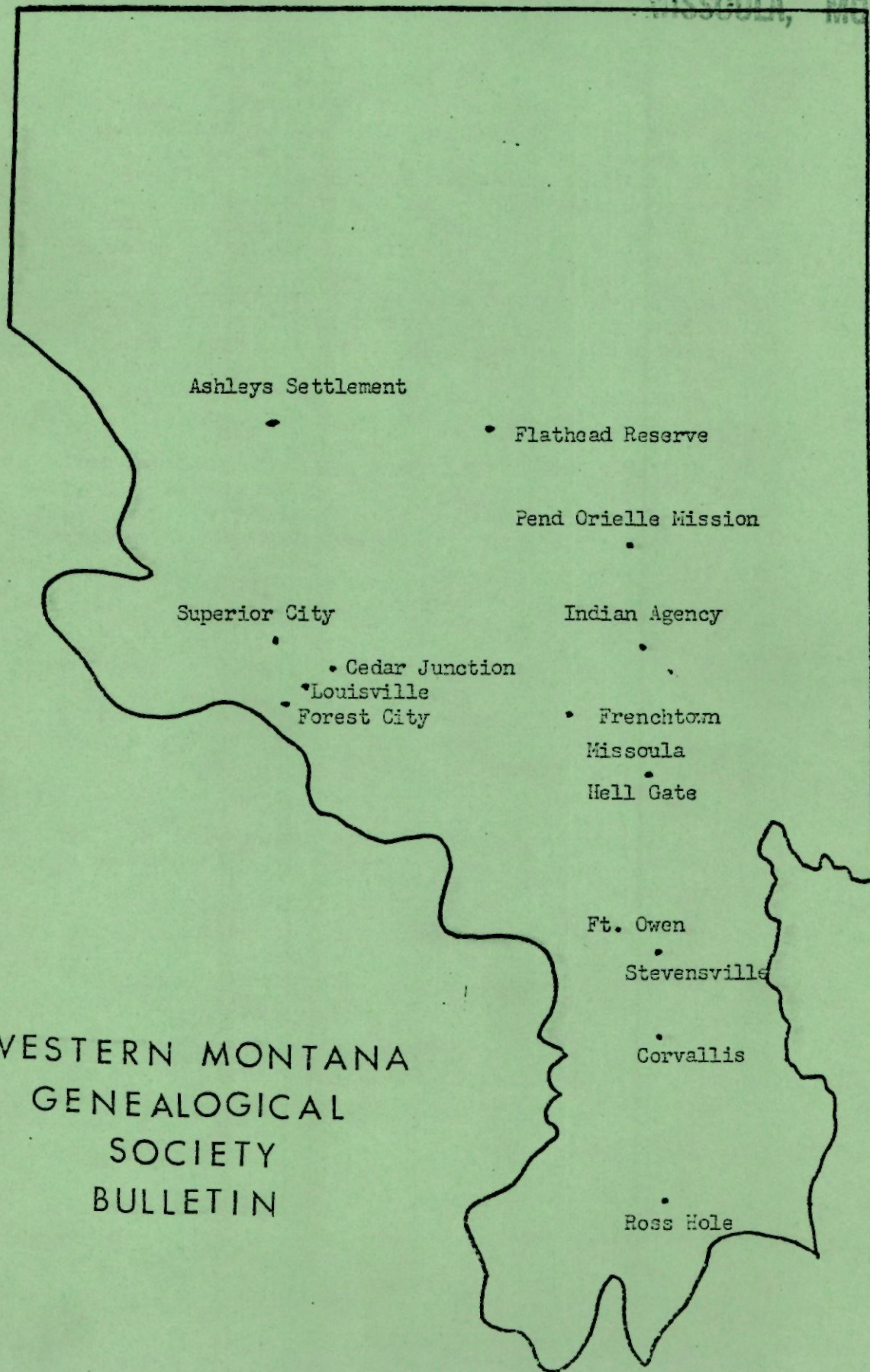

This small cemetery, about 50' square, is located 100 yards west of Hot Springs Junction, just off Highway 28, on the north side of the highway leading to Hot Springs. This cemetery has only two tombstones, and is full of weeds and gopher holes. It is in a sorry state of upkeep. The names on the two tombstones are:

Enoch D. Moore (no dates)

23 Wis. Inf. (Veteran's marker, either Spanish American War or Civil War, I am not certain which).

Wilber W. Cameroa (or Cameron?)

March, 1915 - Dec., '15.

The Lynch Cemetery is located immediately southeast of Plains, about 100 feet east of Highway 200, near the SE corner of the original townsite of Horse Plains.

Neptune Lynch, Jr. born Feb. 16, 1860, died March 20, 1900.

Elizabeth (Williams) Lynch, born Jan. 18, 1863, died August 6, 1925.
(Parenthesis my own, her name is not on the tombstone.)

Neptune Lynch, Sr. born March 17, 1824, died May 25, 1898.

Elizabeth (Alexander) Lynch, born March 4, 1822, died June 28, 1904.
(Parenthesis my own.)

Lea (Lynch) Grinnell, born 1864, died May 29, 1911.

David Grinnell, (born about 1863), died August 10, 1906.

From the Plainsman, January 10, 1913:

William McKay, a bachelor carpenter who has lived at the old Angus McDonald home for the past twenty years, died last Saturday (January 4, 1913) from the effects of a prolonged "spree". He was a Scotchman by birth. Burial took place on the McDonald homestead.

MISSOULIAN, March 23, 1883 (Friday)- Local mention

Mr Henry Wyldes, one of the oldest and most esteemed residents of this county, and for years a familiar figure around Missoula, met with an accident on Wednesday of last week that will probably cost him his life. He took down his shot gun to kill a squirrel at his place, and the gun burst, inflicting severe wounds on the forehead and fracturing the skull - two pieces of bone an inch square falling out and exposing the brain. The wounded man was alone at the time of the accident, but managed to make it to the house of his neighbor, Wm. Furgason, where he was immediately take care of as well as circumstances would permit. Dr. Vorhies, the N.P. Physician, was called, and attended the wounded man, though he have little hope of ultimate recovery. In view of the danger of his situation, Mr. Wyldes made his will. He is possessed of considerable property, which he leaves to his ten-year old daughter, with the desire that it be expended for purposes of edccation.

MISSOULIAN, April 6, 1883 - Horse Plains Items

Henry Wyldes dies a few days after the accident mentioned in a recent issue of the Missoulian, and left a will bequesting everything he owns to his daughter. He also appointed Wm. Furgason and Charles Lynch executors of his estate.

MISSOULIAN, July 6, 1883 - County Correspondence

Wm. Furgason and Wm. Combest, of the Plains, went up to Missoula this week on business connected with the proof of will of the late Henry Wyldes. While in Missoula, Mr. Combest was "caught on jury duty".
